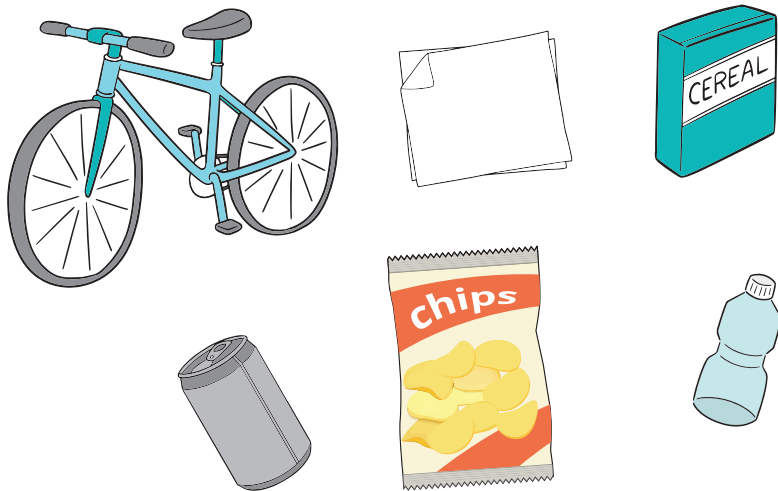
Trash – pet waste, plastic utensils, straw, chip bag, juice box, milk carton; Recycle – steel can, water bottle, soda can, paper; Yard + Food waste – apple core, banana peel, chicken bones, carrot tops, egg shells; Donate – T-shirt, computer

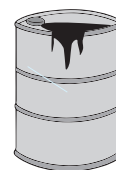

Sandwich bag



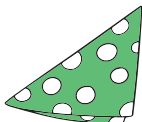
Disposable water bottle
